



Asotin County is known as the Washington half of the Lewis-Clark Valley Banana Belt because of our mild climate which allows golfers to play the four valley golf courses during at least 11 months of the year. Located at the mouth of Hell's Canyon where the Clearwater River merges with the Snake River, valley residents are within 30 minutes of every kind of outdoor recreation activity.

We have easy access to education with the Clarkston campus of Walla Walla Community College and Lewis-Clarks State College located in our neighboring community of Lewiston, Idaho. Washington State University's main campus is located in Pullman, Washington and the University of Idaho in Moscow, Idaho, both only forty minutes away.

Recent comparison's rank our Asotin County cost of living below the national average by 5%. That means our median cost of a home in Asotin County is \$176,125 compared to a State wide median cost of \$370,000. It also means our cost of living is 36% lower than the state wide average for Washington State.
